Several have inquired about the recent tornado to hit our area. Other than the top twisted out of a cedar tree behind stage one we had no damage to the range or to any buildings. Red and I did however pick up considerable debris dropped on the property by the storm. Thankfully the full force of the storm lifted prior to its arrival.

We are getting a little lax about going past the firing line to recover brass. We try to rake the area where most of the brass falls to facilitate its recovery, so if you can reach it with a "picker-upper" from behind the firing line fine, otherwise let's get it after the range is cold. Some shooters like to shoot a little after the stages are finished for the day and I don't want anyone wandering around downrange looking for that last piece of brass while someone is shooting.

We were a little late getting started due to last minute arrivals and that is fine, sometimes you just run late, but we can't start before our posse sheets are done. If you could get here a few minutes early our score keepers and book keepers would appreciate it. At least that is what Red said.

I must say that we have several regular shooters here at Outlaw Camp that could serve as models as to what a cowboy shooter should wear, but I want to pay a special compliment to Moon Dance Kid and High Card Kay, they always look great!
