Please check your category on the score sheet and if there is an error for the Jan. or Feb. shoots please let me know so we can correct it. Our scoring program has a default category for you so if you have ever shot more than one category here it may try to place you in that category. You of course may shoot any category you wish at any time; you just need six in one category to be eligible for year-end awards. Fun Day scores do not count toward year-end awards. Following SASS guidelines we will no longer have Traditional or Modern categories after March 1<sup>st</sup>. These categories are being merged into age based categories where the firearms you currently use, (Modern or Traditional), will be allowed.
